Premier's Research Excellence Awards

Deadline: May 16, 2003

The PREA program awards \$100,000.00 cash to promising, excellent researchers in the early stages of their careers. PREA funding (and the matching funds) may only be used to support members of the applicant's research team.

MATCHING FUNDS:

The applicant must match 50% of the funds requested from PREA (i.e. for a \$100,000 PREA Award, the applicant contributes \$50,000, over a period of up to 5 years). The applicant's matching funds may come from: the university in the form of graduate student stipends or tuition scholarships; industry/business/non-profit sources (except where the intellectual property resulting from the research is owned by the company); or from governments, except that granting council funds (NSERC, CIHR, and SSHRC) are not eligible, nor are funds from other provincial awards programs including ORDCAF.

ELIGIBILITY:

To qualify applicants must have taken up their first full-time academic appointment in 1995 or later. Applicants who took up their first academic appointment July 1, 2001 or later will form a separate candidate pool (subject to some restrictions).

EVALUATION CRITERIA:

Evaluation of PREA applications focuses on the excellence of the applicant's demonstrated research and/or research potential and the importance/promise (i.e. impact) of the applicant's research. All disciplines are eligible for support, but the Program focuses primarily on the physical, natural, life, environmental and health sciences, as well as engineering and mathematics.
