KGH Staff Recognition Awards

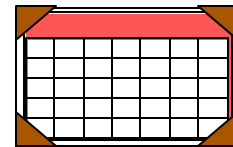

International Program for Animal Alternatives - Proctor & Gamble

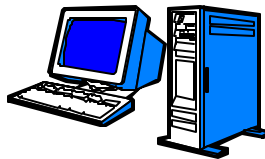

Continue to use the current password until it stops working (the new one is scheduled to kick in early Friday morning but to date this has been highly variable... sometimes not until a day or three later).

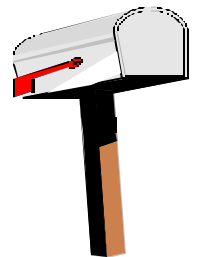
I have hand delivered a page with the new password on it to faculty members within Douglas and Richardson. Students and others will have to stop by my desk in Richardson 201 to pick it up.

What's new in WinPMail v2.4

WinPMail (Pegasus Mail for Windows) v2.4 has a number of important enhancements over previous versions (and will be installed sometime in July): **Global Folder Search** Pegasus Mail now allows you to search for words and phrases across all your folders. The search results are weighted by relevance, the most likely candidates appearing at the top of the list. To activate the folder search, open the Folder Manager window and choose Find text from the Edit menu.

Hot URLs Pegasus Mail's message reader now highlights WorldWide Web links (URLS) and allows you to double click them to activate your web browser. Hot URLs and the web browser Pegasus Mail invokes can be configured using the Clickable Links option on the Preferences menu.

Support for system colours If you would prefer WinPMail to use your system colours in its list controls, check the control labelled Use system colours in list windows in the General Preferences dialog.

There are also a number of small fixes over previous versions of the program, including improvements in the way the ToolTips work.
